The Youth Community Support Program is a new cross-ministry initiative partnership between Boyle Street Community Services, Alberta Health Services and E4C. This partnership aims to provide support to youth and their families who are exiting acute inpatient mental health settings or formal treatment environments. This initiative will consist of a residential intervention service and a community based intervention service.

YCSP offers safe, supportive housing for youth experiencing mental health and addiction issues. As a member of the YCSP team, your primary responsibility will be to provide youth with the stability and supports necessary and assist them in meeting their goals as developed by the multi-disciplinary team. The ultimate goal is healthy family reunification or successful independent living.

Hours: Relief hours. Must be available for Evenings, Overnights and Weekends.

Salary: Starting \$20.78 per hour.

- Help create a safe and welcoming environment for youth.
- Assist youth to actively participate in their treatment/transition plan.
- Navigate crisis and or violent situations.
- Complete administrative duties as needed.

A successful candidate would require:

- Strong interpersonal, non-judgmental, empathetic, flexible and ability to work with initiative and independence.
- Experience/knowledge of addiction, poverty, mental health, abuse.
- Knowledge of harm reduction, resiliency, and solution focused practice.
- 1-2 years working with m populations (youth experience is an asset).
- Aptitude and skill in computer use and database entry.
- Standard First Aid, Suicide Intervention Training, Medication Administration, De-escalation, High Risk Youth, Harm Reduction and Aboriginal Awareness Training.
- Must provide Police Information Check and Child Intervention Check.
