- Uses critical inquiry to assess, plan, and evaluate the implications of interventions that impact the women's outcomes.
- Utilizes relevant and credible resources to inform evidence-based practice in care planning and intervention, including holistic engagement with the women, informed consent, women's needs, values and preferences, collaborative partnerships, empowering communications, health advocacy, access, and autonomy.
- Ability to identify the relationship between person-centered care and health outcomes, including anxiety reduction, satisfaction with health outcomes, engagement and empowerment, rights, needs, goals and preferences, self-management, and self-efficacy.
